Home for Senior Citizen for 50 elderly women

- → 04 medical camps were organized in coordination with local Primary Health Centre and given free treatment for common ailments.

- The District Social Welfare Officer, PHC doctors, District Child Protection Officer, MS, GS and Executive Officer were visited and given suggestions.

Reached 832 community members through outreach activities.

50 senior citizens were supported with counselling assistance, shelter, food, medical care and recreation

04 Medical camps were organized and given free treatment.



"Puthiyapathai" Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts (IRCA)

- At this reporting period, 140 cases were admitted and undergone medical and psychological treatment. Out of that 128 cases are leading drug free life.
- The IRCA received cases through awareness programme, from recovered clients and from All Women Police Station for treatment.
- Conducted Individual Counseling, Group therapy, Family therapy and yoga therapy as part of treatment to beneficiaries admitted in IRCA.
- Home visits and follow up were made to ensure sobriety of beneficiaries and for guidance.
- 12 number of awareness programmes were conducted educating on ill-effects of addiction and functions of IRCA and thereby 874 people were sensitized.

Reached 874 community members through outreach activities, exhibition and sensitization events.

Medical and Psychological treatment given for 140 addicts

128 clients were rehabilitated successfully

"Puthiyapathai" Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts (IRCA)

With the support of the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, organization Avvai Mahalir Kuzhukalin Sangamam (AMKS) executing Puthiyapathai - Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts Perambalur District. At this reporting cases were



admitted and undergone medical and psychological treatment. Out of that 165 cases are leading drug free life.

- The IRCA staff team along with NSS of Govt Arts & Science College, conducted awareness
 programme to young people and thereby sensitized on ill-effects of drug abuse to 120
 students.
- Conducted Individual Counseling, Group therapy, Family therapy and yoga therapy as part of treatment aiming on overall rehabilitation of inmates.
- The rehabilitated inmates were followed up through home visits and given guidance to remain sober.
- 14 number of awareness programmes were conducted among women Self Help Groups, college students, industrial workers and general public and thereby reached 1954 people.
- The Counsellors of the project attended training organized by TTK-Chennai and improved their skills to deliver quality services.
- The project organized exhibition by displaying visual charts and posters and thereby educated industrial workers on ill-effects of drug abuse. Totally 122 were participated.
- District Child Protection Officer (DCPO) of Nagapattinam District visited the IRCA programme and given guidance.
- As per the circular of the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, the project educated clients on Corona virus (Covid-19) followed precautionary steps and maintained centre neat and clean.



Home for Senior Citizen for 50 elderly women

- Home for Senior Citizens for elderly women function in Perambalur & Ariyalur Districts of Tamil Nadu. At this year, the Home for Senior Citizens for elderly women taken care of 50 senior citizens each.
- ♣ Conducted awareness programme on elder care and reached 1352 people. The programme focused on importance of taking care of elderly in the family.
- → Senior citizens at Home are engaged in gardening, basket making, watching television and newspaper reading. 05 medical camps were organized in each project in coordination with local Primary Health Centre and given free treatment for common ailments.
- ♣ Individual counselling, get-together meeting, yoga and recreation activities were created peace of mind and made the senior citizens to feel at home.

"Arumbugal" Girls Children Home:



Avvai Mahalir Kuzhukalin Sangamam (AMKS) is implementing "Arumbugal" Children Home in Peramablur District of Tamil Nadu. This is the one and only Home for girl children exists in the District which addresses children in need of care and support.

The Arumbugal Girls Children Home got registered under section 41 (1) of the Juvenile Justice Care and Protection Act 2015. 04 medical

camps were organized in association with local Primary Health centre. The children learn yoga and participate in educative classes on moral education. The Home accommodated children

referred by Child Welfare Committee functions in Perambalur District of Tamil Nadu. Totally 99 girl children were taken care and restored with parents in consultation with CWC and DCPU. At this reporting period, the District Child Protection Officer, Child Welfare Committee members and Block level officials were visited and given guidance.

Awareness on Corona virus (Covid-19):

As per the instructions and guidance of the Department of Social Defence, the children in the Arumbukal Children Home were educated on precautionary measures of Corona virus (Covid - 19) The District Health Department officials did spot visit and educated the children in the presence of District Child Protection Officer of Perambalur District. The children cleared their doubts and staff team maintained cleanliness of CCI.



Integrated complex of Special Home for Senior Citizens and Destitute Children

Integrated complex of Special Home for Senior Citizens and Destitute Children is one of the programme run by Avvai Mahalir Kuzhukalin Sangamam at Perambalur District benefiting 25 destitute and neglected elders and 28 children. With own source of funding, the organization running the project taking care of the poor and neglected elders in and around the district. Shelter, food, medicine, recreation, yoga and counseling assistance are rendered at free of cost. The organization avail donations and carry out the activities for the elderly. The elders are engaged in yoga, recreation and gardening activities at home. The elders feel at home and staff are extending support with love and care. The children enjoy moving with elderly people by learning moral stories, traditional medicines and good characters.

Swadhar Greh Programme:

Avvai Mahalir Kuzhukalin Sangamam extended care and support to 30 women in difficult circumstances by running Swadhar Greh Programme in Ariyalur District. The inmates are trained on vocational trades such as tailoring, Basket making, Embroidering and Paper cover making.



During this reporting period, the project conducted 48 village level awareness programmes and

totally 1872 members were participated. The programme focused on women rights, legal provisions, domestic violence act 2005, dowry act, marriage act and functions of various allied systems such as Free legal Aid, services of All women police station and women helpline. All inmates were provided food, clothing, medical facilities and recreation. Medical officers visited the programme four times in a month and examined the inmates' health on a regular basis. Observed World Women's Day in coordination with community stakeholders and sensitized the general public about women rights and functions of Swadhar Greh programme.

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
